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# MR ROBST'S CLASS

**Year 2 - 4 Students wrote picture books innovated from the book Oi Dog! by Claire Gray and Kes Gray**

**Students read their writing aloud.**

**Writing Outcomes included**

- adding suffixes for plurals
- spelling
- rhyme
- self editing
- entertaining

“We had to first write rhyming words. Then we did a rough copy into our books. Then we divided it into sections to make pages so page 1 had the number 1 on it. We dressed up and read the book in the accent we needed.” Rachel

“We listened to a story with Mr Robst called ‘Dogs on Frogs’ and then we had to get a piece of paper and fold it in half and then had to put words that rhymed on each side. I used words like ‘bears sit on snares.’ We had to then write a story in our books and then Mr Robst filmed us. We had to be smiling and being a character. I thought it was fun.” Callan

“ Mr Robst told me to read my book as best as I could. We learnt about plurals. Plurals are when you add an s or es onto a word. My book was called Frogs on Logs.” Mila

“My book was called “Beagles and Eagles.” We were learning about plurals where you add to a word because there is more there. I added an s to the end of the word because there was more of them.” Levi
