What is DIPG?

DIPG, or **diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma**, is a type of brain tumour found in an area of the brainstem known as the pons. The name diffuse intrinsic pontine glioma describes how the tumour grows, where it is found, and what kinds of cells give rise to the tumour. DIPG primarily affects children, with most diagnoses occurring between 5 and 7 years of age. It makes up 10-15% of all brain tumours in children. Unfortunately, fewer than 10% of children survive two years from diagnosis.
