This term we are also introducing Kimochis to the students. We have received extra funding for me to be able to do this and I am really excited to be able to offer this learning to all the students and families.

WHAT ARE KIMOCHIS?



Kimochi (KEY.MO.CHEE) means "feeling" in Japanese.

We know that sometimes all of us have big feelings and this can lead to challenging behaviours. Sometimes it can be hard to communicate our feelings. Kimochis are a playful way for us to be able to learn how to identify and express our feelings in an OK way. Kimochis help develop positive social skills that help build lasting friendships and success in other areas of life as well.

This term I will be introducing, each week, a Kimochi character and their feelings as well as a tool for helping with big feelings. I will be including families in this learning via dojo with the hope that kids can share what they have learnt at school and reinforce the strategies for managing big feelings.



This month we are looking at careers and the qualifications you need to progress to a role that may be your dream career. Living in a rural area, sometimes it seems too hard - but it can be done!

The Australian Qualifications Framework is a comprehensive framework with 10 levels, representing increasing complexity and depth of knowledge required in qualifications for different careers in Australia.

It is an important tool for women who are seeking to further their education or career, providing a way to understand the study requirements for different careers. To progress your career, it is possible to start with entry level qualifications and then study other courses to move through the AQF levels.

Do you ever wonder how someone who was a cleaner at the local hospital, then became a registered nurse? By studying, higher level courses from where you start your learning, you can keep building on your skills. You do not have to stay at one level your entire career if you have goal to achieve more. The AQF framework is on the next page with example roles in the health sector.

Vision Your Future

During 2022, we worked with the SA Skills Commission to develop a nicrocredential to assist women with their future life and career goals. A microcredential is a short, assessable course where participants earn a digital badge and certificate to show they have skills in certain areas. Dur microcredential has now been endorsed for delivery and we welcome ou to be first to test it.
