Dear parents and community,

The term is flying by with plenty of engaging learning opportunities happening in and out of the classroom. Hosting Tumby Bay Area School Students for our kitchen/garden session, Science Week activities and commencing gymnastics has definitely kept us all busy in a positive way.

I have been very impressed with the quality of writing displayed in the class-room. The Junior Primary books they created are very interesting and well presented. I also enjoyed the Upper Primary advertisement posters and explanations of their persuasive language and visual choices. Both classes are focusing on information reports as their writing genre this term. I love going into class-rooms and asking students about what they are learning (learning intentions), why they are learning (purpose) it and how they know they have learnt it (success criteria). Students are improving at answering these questions and generally demonstrating deeper learning. It is worth trying these questions with your children at home.

The Year 1 students have conducted their Phonics Screen test and achieved outstanding results. We will be having PAT (Progressive Achievement Test) assessments through Week 8. With all this data coupled with NAPLAN data, we will be having a Student Free Day on Monday Week 9 (18th September). We will then discuss student progress and future goals during student/parent interviews during Week 10.

Looking forward to our Book Week Celebration on Monday. It is always great to see everyone dressed up and share the passion of reading. It will be particularly exciting sharing this occasion with the play centre families. Thank you to Jeff and Levi for organising the food as a fundraiser for our playground. Please get your orders in for this ASAP.

Exploring the Cosmos: Science Week 2023

at Ungarra Primary School

From August 14th to August 18th, the school embarked on a fascinating journey into the cosmos, turning the spotlight on the Eyre Peninsula Space Explorers Makers Empire 3D Printing Course. This unique initiative, embraced by schools throughout the Eyre Peninsula, aimed to infuse the minds of students with the wonders of space exploration and the boundless opportunities it presents.

Students delved into Australia's role in the space industry using the challenge course to view videos and answer questions through quizzes. Throughout this exciting challenge, teachers will be collaborating with students in a quest to learn about space-related problems and challenges using design thinking and inquiry-based learning. Participating schools, armed with new 3D printers and fresh insights into space exploration, will now forge ahead in their quests to solve space-related challenges. The knowledge gained during the Eyre Peninsula Space Explorers Makers Empire 3D Printing Course will undoubtedly fuel innovative ideas and inspire future scientists, engineers, and dreamers. A showcase event awaits in November at Port Lincoln, where the culmination of efforts and creative designs will be proudly displayed.

For the Junior Primary class, the voyage into space exploration began in their regular science lessons, these young minds had been delving into the mysteries of the cosmos. Their enthusiasm was infectious, and they even boasted a rocket of their own within their classroom—a testament to the boundless potential of nurturing young scientific minds.

On Thursday, August 17th, Science Week at Ungarra Primary School took an even more exciting turn. The school welcomed representatives from Southern Launch, who delivered an illuminating lesson on space exploration

and, more intriguingly, South Australia's role in various space projects. The spotlight shone on the launch site at Whaler's Way, highlighting the significant contribution of the region to space innovation. Students were treated to an opportunity to launch their own rockets in the schoolyard, putting theory into action and feeling the exhilaration of propelling their creations toward the heavens. This hands-on experience was enjoyed by all!




