

PRINCIPAL'S REPORT CONT.

Ungarra Primary School believes in creating stimulating and challenging experiences to empower children and young people to thrive in a rapidly changing world. They encourage creative and critical thinking, adaptiveness and technological engagement to prepare learners for the future.

The school provides many opportunities beyond the classroom to extend learning. Through the Enterprise group, years 3 to 6 collaboratively create fundraising opportunities that develop essential skills in communication, planning, finance and marketing. The site also engages with the local community through hosting community groups and guest speakers.

Their unique kitchen garden program allows learners to harvest produce and cook meals, instilling a handson, sustainable approach to food education and responsibility through their individual mini farming plots.

Cross-aged learning enables collaboration among children and young people from different classes and neighbouring sites, promoting teamwork and peer mentoring.

School has continued to be a fun and busy place with gymnastics, science week, book week and touch football carnival in recent weeks.

In technology students have participated in the Commissioners Digital Challenge which focuses on systems thinking and coding. This is great preparation for our other lessons such as Eyre Peninsula Kids in Space Program and our school's use of the Future Education Loan Kit Devices such as 360 degree camera, drone, Kai's Clan Robots and VR headsets.

Teachers have engaged with coaching sessions provided by Lyn Coote and I have been able to follow up on focus areas of development with each teacher with walkthroughs, observations and 1:1 coaching conversations. Both teachers have been open to feedback and improvement is being seen across the school.

Still to come this term is tennis lessons with Paul Polkinghorne, Year 3-4 tennis tournament, SMG seminar on friendships at Port Neill, PAT testing and parent/teacher interviews.

There is a Student Free Day on Monday Week 9. This will provide staff with much needed time to analyse PAT data and other data sets to then forward plan for each student. The PAT team will be coming to do professional development with our staff.

I would like to thank Shannon Jeffrey for her work over the last few weeks whilst being on her teaching placement. She has improved throughout and provided some engaging learning opportunities for her students. We also welcome Ella Rodda for her Term 4 placement in the upper primary class. She will have two lead in days at the end of this term to meet everyone and help prepare for

her placement.






UPPER PRIMARY NEWS


